The allocation proposal for a new estate of 140 households on the "Seedfied Site" does not cite specific details of relevant local factors or give commitment to ensuring they are effectively addressed.
	1. Parkinson Street has for years been a problem caused by the amount of traffic travelling to and from the Seedfield Centre when it was being used for various purposes on top of the long-established community service activities of both St. John's Church Hall and Seedfield Bowling Club - both of which rely on Parkinson Street for parking,
	The emergency services have on occasions damaged wing mirrors etc in trying to squeeze through vehicles parked on both sides. This summer even with the discontinued use of the Seedfield Site, visiting motorists have parked outside residents houses in Seedfield Road because Parkinson Street was full.
	Residents of 140 new homes would need to go out to work, shop, transport children to school and other activities, keep appointments etc. so the traffic would be much increased.
	2. Education access: local primary schools are already full; there are children in our street not able to access places in their local schools because there are not enough places, so they have to travel some distance away. With 140 new households presumably including families with children, extra time travelling and cost and fuel usage, and not able to be with their own community circle of friends wold be the result.
	3. The GMCA plan talks of the importance of physical activity and sport, leisure and recreational space for physical and mental health and well-being as well as developing sports skills. The Seedfield Site currently has playing fields on Greenbelt land, and this would be lost by the allocation proposal.
