The main road through Boothstown is currently exceptionally busy and during peak times is used as a cut-through to the M60 by people travelling east along the A580 as well as those living in the areas north of the A580 (Tyldesley, Atherton, Astley, etc.). We have already seen an increase in traffic since the opening of RHS Bridgewater and will see further increases as the new housing builds progress at Mosley Common, as well as the new houses still being built to the south of Boothstown and at Simpson Grove. So many new houses in this locality increases this problem, as well as adding to potential issues with air quality.
	Furthermore, there is a population of Roe deer that have been resident in this area for generations, their habitat is being eroded away into near non-existence. There have been culls in recent times due to their proximity to RHS Bridgewater, I see no way that the deer population won"t be further impacted, and presumably culled, to make way for more new housing.
