Mosley common rd and most other routes in the area are nose to tail from 06:30am until 10:30am and the same again from 15:00 until 18:30.</p> <p>It can sometimes take me 20minutes to get onto the A580 from 500 metres away.</p> <p>To justify putting an extra 1100 new houses and a minimum of an extra 1400 cars into an area that clearly can not hold the amount of traffic now is a serious duty of care failure to the residents, school children, businesses etc of the area.</p> <p>The local school put up signs on the school fence from Wigan council, stating please turn of engine, no idling to protect our children when dropping them off. There is a queue of traffic 2 mile long going pass the school every school day. Action speak louder the words.</p> <p>The so called 'Climate emergency policy' all the council's are currently under at the moment should be followed and implemented. If not what is the point of it, Wigan council headline against climate emergency even states:</p> <p>Our Natural Environment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - We will protect, enhance and maintain the Borough's natural environment. - We will deliver an ambitious tree planting programme. - We will reduce grounds maintenance and programmes such as verge cutting to help naturalise the Borough and promote increased biodiversity.
