Please be as precise as possible.</b>	<p>There are several reasons why this plan is unsound.</p> <p>Traffic in the area is already heavy, with Mosley Common road not fit for the current volume of traffic. The area around St John's school and Eddie's motor spares is a bottleneck due to insufficient parking for current residents. This reduces the road to one lane for both directions to use, further increasing local pollution as cars stop and start constantly, using more fuel and creating higher emissions. The junction with the East Lancs is also unsuitable with one large vehicle turning right causing tailbacks as other vehicles cannot pass.</p> <p>There is increased pollution in the area, going against the clean air directives.</p> <p>As an asthma sufferer I have noticed the change in the air already from the current Belway development. The amount of dust and soil from that development, along with the Parr Bridge development, is visible along Mosley Common Road, with sections of dirt inches deep in parts. This has also affected air quality.</p> <p>A further reduction in green space in the area is an environmental concern, affecting local wildlife such as Kestrels, Sparrowhawks, Buzzards and Kites along with their prey.</p> <p>The reduction in green space also affects pollution levels, its a well known fact that trees absorb harmful airborne chemicals and CO2. If anything, we should be planting more trees in this space and looking at reducing traffic to protect our children's future.</p> <p>As a parent I am concerned that the increased traffic is a hazard to my children, making the area dangerous for them with only 1 traffic controlled pedestrian crossing between the guided bus lane and the East Lancs.</p> <p>I am also concerned that building on our green space reduces children's chances of experiencing and exploring nature.</p>
