If you compare what is currently present to the plans you can see that the council has been sold short. |
| | Greenbelt: Greenbelt was designated in the first place to protect it from development the loss of which would have a detrimental affect on the surrounding areas. Green belt should remain a natural buffer between built up areas providing some natural space for local people. Regard should be had for public rights of way which give people access to a small piece of countryside in an urban area. This combined with developers not sticking to plans for public open spaces should raise concern. Public Transport: whilst the guided busway provides acceptable transport, it is often plagued with service disruptions. The area is badly provided for in terms of public transport with only one main route into Manchester along the |

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East Lancashire Road but this is mainly oversubscribed from Salford and Leigh. Bus services from/through Mosley Common have been seriously curtailed in recent years making access to doctors surgeries, hospitals, shops and schools extremely difficult.

- 7. Schools: Local schools are all oversubscribed meaning that children will have to travel greater distances to both primary and secondary schools adding further to congestion.
- 8. Heritage: This site is in close proximity to many heritage assets. This development could significantly harm the setting of these heritage assets.
- 9. General infrastructure: As mentioned lack of suitable road network, access to most other services (Doctors, Chemists, gyms, and hospitals). There are issues with soakaways and sewage on the Garret Manor eccleston Homes development which have not been addressed by the developer. Is there adequate access to main sewers without overloading existing sewers (already flood problems in the area)?
