Greater Manchester's diverse cyber and digital security community lies at the heart of the digital sector's success. It has connected the component parts of the city region, – as a testbed for cross-sector collaboration, innovation, specialist talent and a clear vision for the future.

From developing the world's first stored program computer in the 1940s, to being the

home of graphene and voted by Data City as the UK's Top Digital Tech City, we have a proud heritage that pioneers Greater Manchester as the new home of responsible cyber that delivers social value for people and businesses.

Greater Manchester has a world leading responsible cyber ecosystem driven by inclusivity and diversity, for the safety, security and prosperity of the city-region and the UK.

The Greater Manchester cyber ecosystem is built on collaboration; our Cyber Advisory Group comprises has increased to over 40 organisations since 2018 and is driving innovation and inclusive growth to realise our ambitious vision to make Greater Manchester a truly world leading ecosystem. A region for bold and ambitious collaborations

The Greater Manchester cyber journey gained pace in 2016, when four universities joined forces with local government to create the **Greater Manchester Cyber Foundry** - a programme for small-medium sized businesses to support business growth through security. The Foundry is a partnership of four universities from the North West, using the strength of academic expertise to help defend, innovate and grow businesses in Greater Manchester, empowering SMEs to protect their operations and assets by strengthening their cyber defences.

The **Greater Manchester Al Foundry** soon followed, as did a series of GCHQ-led engineering and innovation accelerators. The North West Cyber Resilience Centre (then Greater Manchester Cyber Resilience Centre) – a not-for-profit venture between North West police forces and Manchester Digital was scaled nationally, a £10m Greater Manchester Cyber Hub commitment was made and new university research and academic networks established.

The Northwest Partnership for Security and Trust

The team of universities behind the Greater Manchester Cyber Foundry innovate and provide academic support to the industry, developing the Greater Manchester Al Foundry. More recently the University of Manchester joined up with GCHQ along with three other North West-based universities to create a "Security and Trust Partnership" in the North West that will see closer ties with academia. In a first for the intelligence, cyber and security agency, the new partnership will see GCHQ publish its own research jointly with the universities. Previously all research written by the intelligence services has been kept within national security circles only.

SPRITE+

The University of Manchester lead a consortium of five national universities bringing together people involved in research, practice, and policy with a focus on digital contexts. A 'one stop shop' for engagement between academic and non-academic communities - a way for these communities to connect and a platform for building collaborations across the spectrum of issues relating to security, privacy, identity and trust.

This spirit of collaboration extends across sectors, disciplines and geographic boundaries.

A thriving and diverse business sector

The city regions cyber profile has attracted national and international attention, with cyber divisions of defence companies, such as Raytheon, Northrop Grumman and BAE Systems AI, creating bases in the city, alongside a growing line-up of businesses setting up or relocating to the city.

Greater Manchester has nurtured homegrown digital security companies, such as NCC Group and Secarma. It has also welcomed Roke and Sophos, which both launched bases in the city during 2021. The cyber economy across the city region has now reached £500m, comprising over 300 companies.

Pioneering not for profit partnerships

Piloted in Greater Manchester before expanding across the region, the **North West Cyber Resilience Centre** takes a leading role in ensuring that every business within the region have the skills and knowledge to protect themselves from online attacks to make the region one of the safest places to live, work and do business. The model has shaped the national approach to Cyber Resilience Centres replicated across all regions of the UK.

Research excellence and academic partnerships

From the Greater Manchester Cyber Foundry to the Northwest Partnership for Security and Trust, Greater Manchester's universities are at the forefront of cyber research.

The **University of Manchester's Digital Futures** is a highly interdisciplinary network that operates across the whole range of the University of Manchester's digital research. Digital Futures aims to present a coherent overview of the digital research activity to external stakeholders and bring together research communities to explore new research areas and address strategic opportunities.

The location of National Cyber Force in Lancashire and the commitment to support a new North West Cyber Corridor is cementing the regions' role in UK defence.



Catalysing innovation

Continuing to build the cyber community and ensure innovation and successive growth over the next five years

Digital Innovation and Security Hub (DISH)

In early 2021, Manchester City Council selected a consortium, headed up by Barclays Eagle Labs, to operate the new Greater Manchester DISH. Launching in Summer 2022, DISH will work with academia and corporates to drive innovation and growth in Greater Manchester's digital and cyber security sectors.

In addition, DISH will inspire and educate the future workforce by offering cyber and digital skills workshops working with local primary schools, colleges and employers

Through this partnership, we have a great opportunity to accelerate the growth of Manchester's digital security ecosystem, at a time when the industry is becoming ever more vital." Greater Manchester's innovation pedigree was recognised by government in identifying the city region as the site of one of three new innovation accelerator, which will build on the established Innovation Greater Manchester model and provide a catalyst for investment in R&D helping business in the city thrive.

It is an exciting time for the cyber sector. Greater Manchester recognises the need to futureproof our sector by developing the next generation of cyber and digital intelligence specialists. We are working with our industry partners to provide new accessible routes into the industry, such as apprenticeships and skills bootcamps, BAE Systems Digital Intelligence engaging with young people to inspire a career in cyber as well as working with industry to ensure we cultivate the cultures to recruit, retain and develop diverse talent.

Over 36,000 students graduate from Greater Manchester universities each year and many more across the North West as a whole, with 51% staying in the city region.

Locally commissioned Cyber Bootcamps and Skills for Growth programmes complement the university strengths to offer re and up-skilling opportunities, with Greater Manchester acting as a testbed for skills development, piloting these new approaches and ensuring these approaches connect with the diversity of the population.

Manchester-based skills providers such as, **CAPSLOCK**, **Tech Returners** and **CodeYourFuture** are helping career switchers, returners and minority groups to access skills training to enter the sector.

Greater Manchester performs well in several skills areas including cyber security, cloud computing AI and Data science where not only is it second to London but comfortably ahead of the next best city in third for access to talent.
