Introduction

A lot of services have gone **online**. This means you have to be able to go on the internet to use them.



So you need a digital device such as a:

- smart phone
- tablet
- computer



and:

an internet connection



and:

- know how to use them
- be able to afford them



If people do not have this equipment, know how to use it, or cannot pay for an internet connection, it makes it harder for them to use services, such as:



- emailing
- booking appointments
- reporting things to your council



- online shopping
- getting information

This is called **digital exclusion**.



We want disabled people in Greater Manchester to be able to get online and benefit from all the opportunities digital brings.

About Skills Bootcamps

A 'Boot Camp' is training that quickly gives people the skills they need to do something. GMCA runs Skills Boot Camps about different industries including digital.

The courses:

- are free
- last up to 16 weeks
- are for people in Greater Manchester over 19 years of age

Unemployed people who finish the training will get a job interview with a local employer.

There is support for people on the courses available from different places.

About social tarrifs

A lot of internet service providers and mobile phone companies offer Social Tariffs. These are cheaper broadband and phone packages for people claiming Universal Credit, Pension Credit and some other benefits.

Each company has their own rules about who can go on a Social Tariff, they have different prices, internet speeds and length of contract. Most do not charge a set-up fee.

Look at each of the different providers to see what they are offering.
